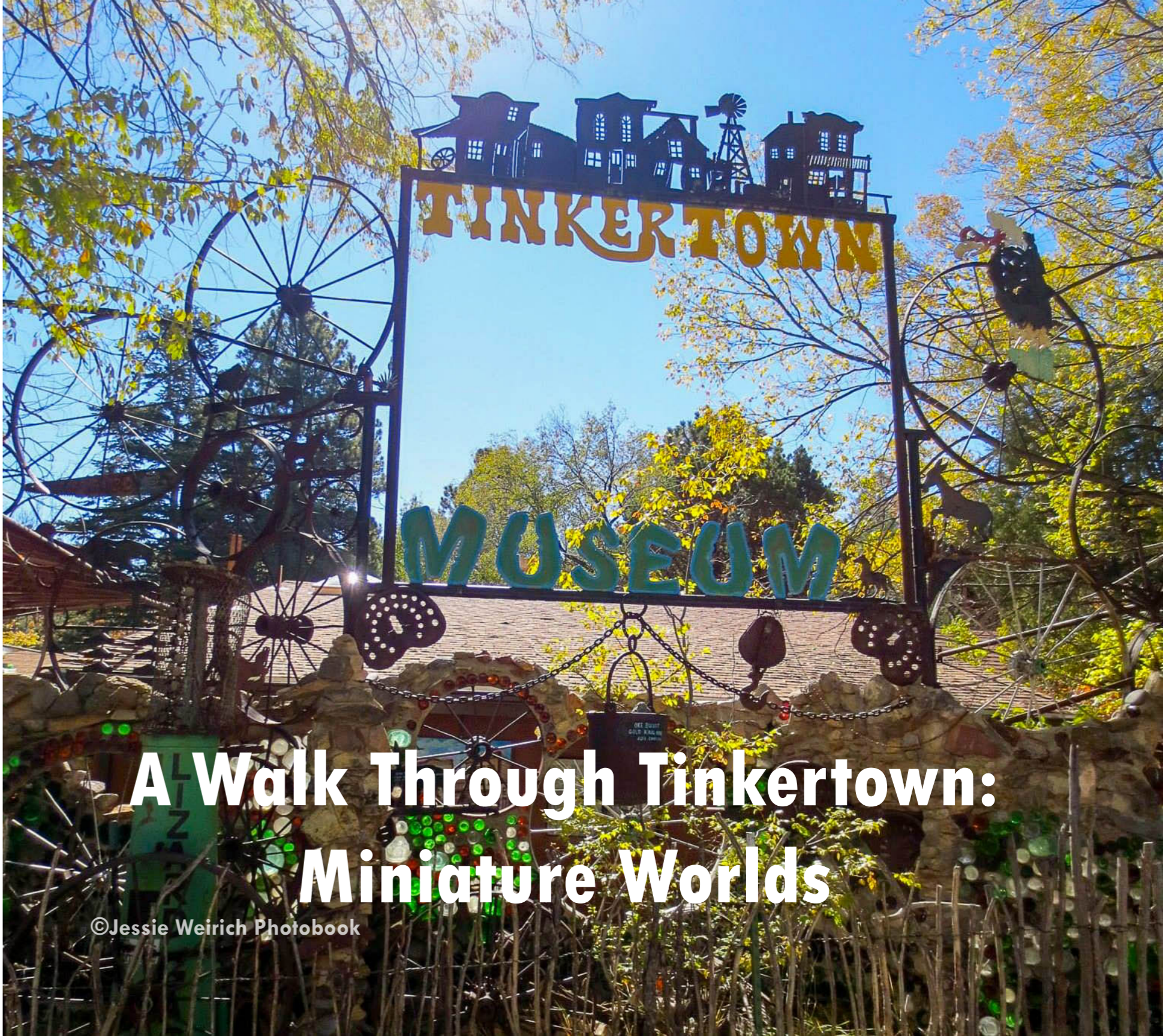

Handcrafted cabinets contain carefully curated relics from the past.

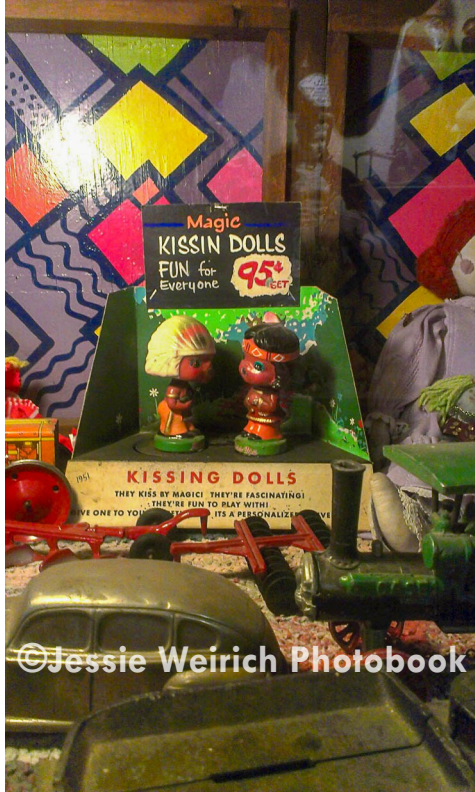

like this vintage red wagon built into a wall of bottles.



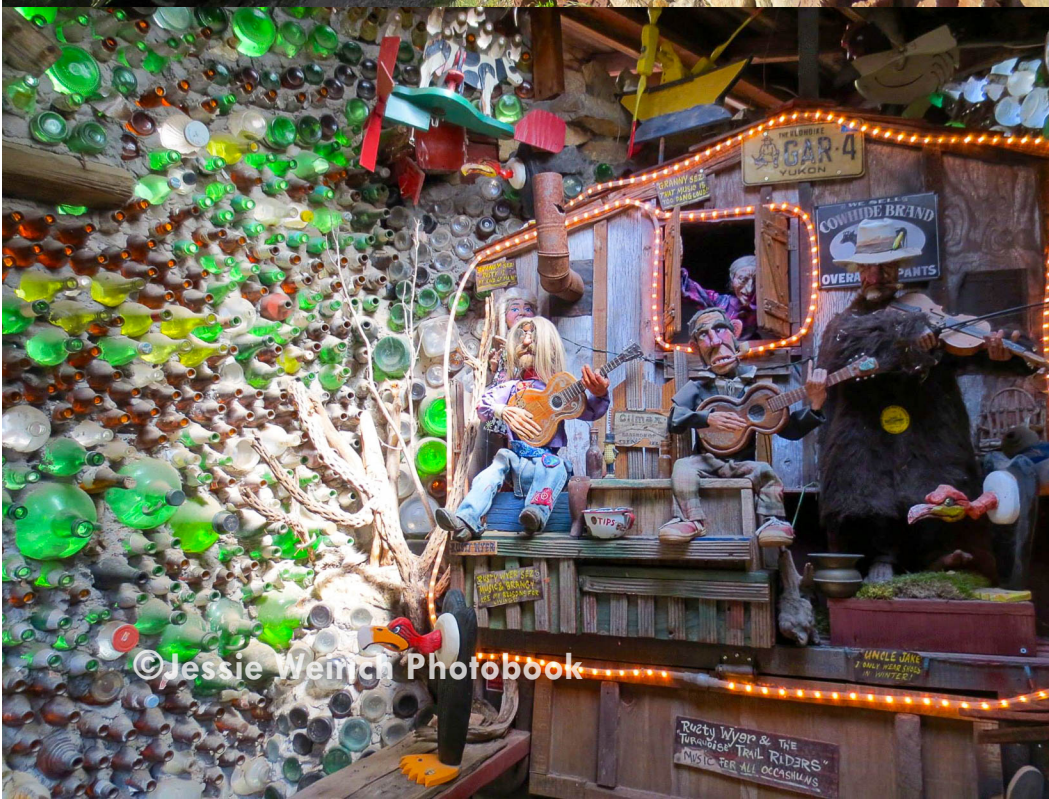

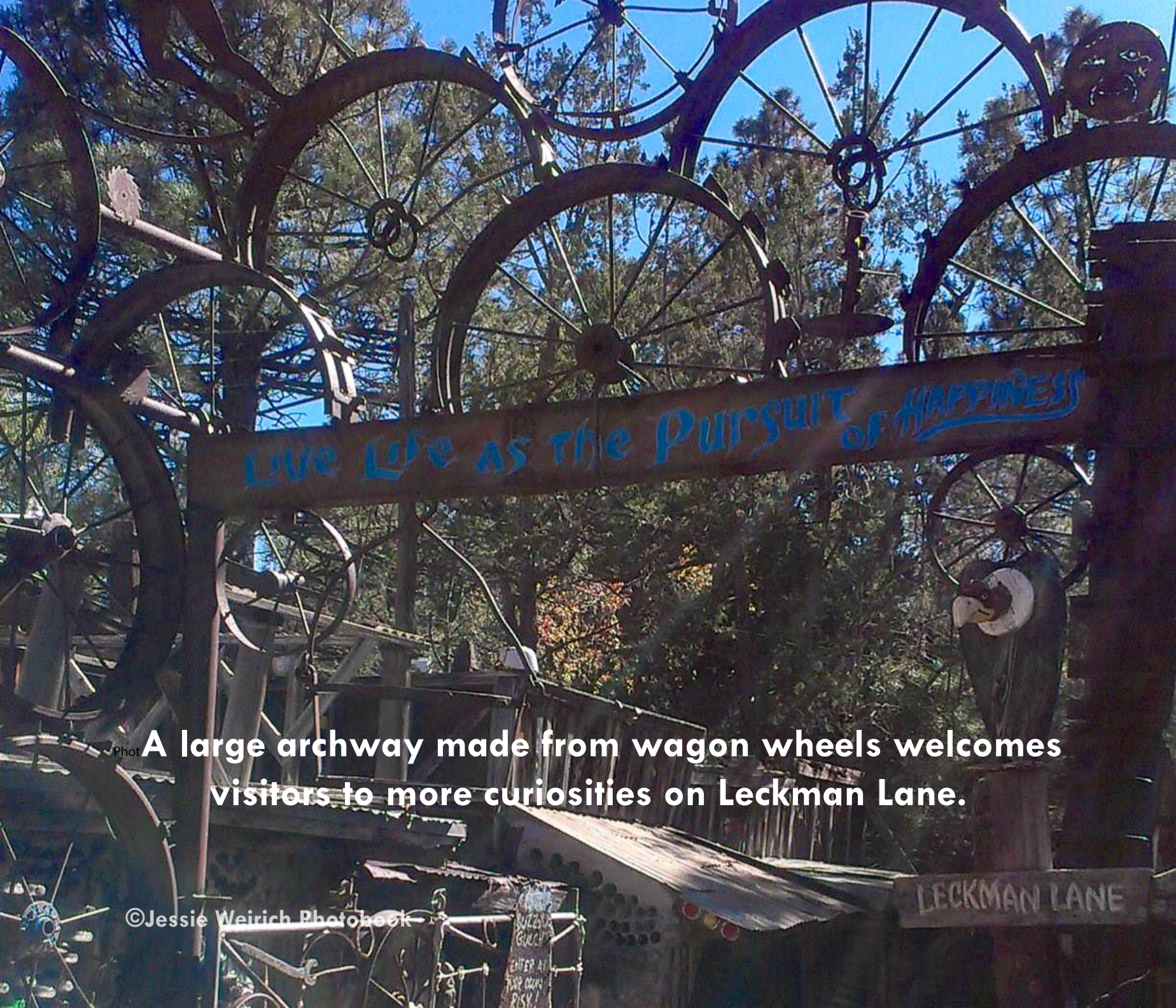
